3. Grades will be calculated according to percentage of points earned.

A = 89.5% - 100%

B = 79.5% - 89.4%

C = 69.5% - 79.4%

F = below 69.5%

***Please note: In keeping with the policies of NOW Academy and LAUSD, no "D"s will be conferred.**

4. Students should keep all returned work. Grades may not be altered without the relevant work.

5. All students are eligible to seek Honors credit. To receive Honors credit in English 9 A or B, a student must maintain a "B" average or higher and complete up to ***five assignments in addition to the standard curriculum.***

These extra assignments may include, but are not limited to:

■ extra assigned novels or other supplementary reading

■ extra writing assignments, including at least one formal essay

■ extra projects, including research and/or community action projects

■ extra presentations and/or class demonstrations.

Determination of a student's eligibility for enrollment in Honors English 9 will be made at the fifteen week progress report.

Although each student is ultimately and personally responsible for her/his own performance, parents and teachers can form a team to encourage the greatest learner achievement. Therefore, please consider me available and our classroom open to you at all times. Visit if you can.
