<u>Metaphor</u> <u>Comparison made without using like or as.</u>

5. The stars winked at me as I searched for the constellations.

<u>Personification</u> <u>Human qualities were given to the stars.</u>

6. Her smile was a mile wide when she saw her new computer.

<u>Hyperbole</u> <u>Extreme exaggeration is used to describe her smile.</u>

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
