ethnographies	scientific descriptions of the customs of individual peoples or cultures
subsequent	coming after something in time; following
rebuffed	rejected in an abrupt or ungracious manner
inadvertently	by accident
dovetail	to join or fit together compactly
repertoire	: one’s personal skill that is used as a habit : all the things a person or group is able to do
contextualize	to consider a word, idea, event, activity, etc. together with everything relating to it in order to understand it better
correlate	: to have a close connection with something : to show that a close connection exists between (two or more things)
precipitate	to cause (an event or situation, typically one bad or undesirable) to happen suddenly, unexpectedly, or prematurely
biases	particular tendencies or inclinations, especially those that create judgments based on prejudice
diffident	modest or shy because of lack of self-confidence
prodding	persuading or encouraging someone to do something
corroborate	confirm or give support to
inadequacies	the state of lacking the quantity or quality required
rapport	a close and harmonious relationship in which the people or group concerned understand each other’s feeling or ideas and communicate well
exploiting	: making full use of and derive benefit from (a resource) : using (a situation or person) in an unfair or selfish way
elicit	to draw out of or bring forth; evoke
moderation	the avoidance of excess or extremes, especially in one's behavior
scrutiny	critical observation or examination
initiate	begin; get started
metacognitive	thoughtful about thinking
avid	enthusiastic; eager; greedy
