- Through the Habits of Heart and Mind projects, students will gain an understanding of the school-wide core values and expected learners outcomes.

Evaluation

- Academic Supports and Consultancy (40%) Students learn study skills and work on classwork, tutoring during study hall. Student organizes their binders and consult with their advisor.
- Projects (40%) these projects include quick time-sensitive projects and long praxis-style projects
 - Quick Projects these are quick, time-sensitive individual or group projects that showcases precision of expression, collaboration and responsibility.
 - Long Praxis Projects these projects are long-term projects with many different components that showcases all of the Habits of Mind and Heart. Projects include:
- FRESHMAN: Digital Portfolios, HOHM Videos, Poster Projects, etc.
 Assignments & Homework (10%)
 - Skills Development these activities will develop the conventions and standards of the class such as lesson planning, workshop presentation skills, etc.
 - Reflection, Discussions and Journals these reflections showcase the students ability to think about their own growth, their thinking and personal perspectives about given topics.
 - Quizzes through Engrade quick quizzes to test your general knowledge of a subject

Grading

- A (90% to 100%): Level of <u>Distinction</u>

 students earning the level of distinction shows excellence in their classroom performance and the precision of expression of the course's convention and standards.
- B (80% to 89%): Level of <u>Mastery</u> students earning the level of mastery shows that students have mastered the course's convention and standards
- C (68% to 79%): Level of <u>Proficiency</u>

 students earning the level of proficiency shows that students are proficient with the course's convention and standards but also shows that students can still show improvement in order to master the course's conventions and standards
- F (0% to 67%): <u>Not Meeting Class</u> <u>Standards</u> - students falling in this range have not enough work, have not shown enough emergent quality in their work to merit proficiency or opportunity to prove proficiency. Students who fail the class will not earn 5 credits.

- > IDs visible, electronic invisible (unless otherwise instructed)


Attendance and activities
